

***Islands in the Stream: Cuban Maps from the Past to the Future,***  
**A Lecture by Julio Cesar Perez Hernandez, Architect and Urban Planner**  
**May 13 at Noon in the Mumford Room of the Madison Building of the**  
**Library of Congress**



Mr. Perez Hernandez, an internationally published author, will offer a rich visual presentation—combining maps, old engravings and plans—to narrate the history of Cuba, the largest island in the Caribbean, and its relationship with the rest of America since colonial times. The lecture will begin with the 1500 Juan de la Cosa Map of Cuba, the first one to demonstrate that Cuba was an island, and will conclude with Mr. Perez Hernandez’s own “Master Plan for XXI Century Havana.”

Anthony Páez Mullan will offer introductory remarks. Mr. Mullan is a cartographic reference specialist with a focus on Latin America, the Caribbean, and the Iberian peninsula in the Geography and Map Division.
