Dear Mr. Bray:

Your letter to Ken Clark regarding photographs has reached my desk.

I presume that by this time you have received the six dust storm and erosion pictures which we recently mailed to you. We shall try to get out additional material of this sort and forward it on to you. As you know, we have little of this type of thing which was taken by our own photographers, but we can give you copies of other stuff.

A little bit later on, I think we shall be able to have a photographer sent down to your Region for a little while. I wonder if you could send me a memorandum giving me some idea of the projects to be photographed and any additional photographs other than projects which you think worthwhile. Also, suggest how soon the photographer could really do effective work in that Region.

If the dust gets to blowing again in that country very badly, it seems to me that it would be advisable to rush a photographer down, and let him stay there long enough to get a good set of "dust bowl" pictures. What do you think of that.

The Administrator's Office has moved over to the Barr Building and Information plans to follow soon.
